Reflections on Life

It does not seem like we should be thinking about the holiday season yet. Was it not just yesterday that we were listening to the sounds of cicadas, smelling the freshly cut grass, and watching the sun set at a reasonable hour? I do not know about you, but the older I get, the faster time moves! It should bring to our attention how important our focus needs to be on our spiritual life. The Bible reminds us in James 4:13-14 about the temporary state of our physical life: "Come now, you who say, 'Today or tomorrow we will go into such and such a town and spend a year there and trade and make a profit', yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes."

They realize the peace and comfort being looked for can not be satisfied in physical goods. The Bible says in Philippians 4:4-7: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I will say rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your request be made known to God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."
