I want to extend a heartfelt welcome to all of our Chase Park families and our guest families today!

You might be wondering why we chose to have a “Family Day,” at Chase Park. When the idea of “Family Day” was hatched, it came out of concern of the influence the world was having on our families. What might have been taboo 15-20 years ago is now the norm (ball games and extra curricular activities of various kinds encroaching on Wednesdays and Sundays, hours and hours of homework a night, for young people, 60+ hour work weeks for parents, etc.). Family

time, including time spent together in the word of God, is under attack by Satan. Make no mistake, one of Satan’s tools is to keep us busy, to keep us distracted. Satan does a masterful job in using things that are not sinful in and of themselves to pull us away from the God who loves us. Satan does not necessarily have to get us involved in a lifestyle of sin, he can just keep us too busy to worry about our relationship with God, the sin will follow.

The psalmist, through inspiration, says it best “*Be still, and know that I am God*” (Psalm 46:10). I hope you will stick around for the entire day of activity during our “Family Day,” and let us grow closer to God while growing closer to one another!

Grace Is Not Easy—*Nathan Adams*

Too many people wrongly use God’s grace as a means to make living for Christ easy. They don’t make the needed changes to their lives because they say, “grace will take care of it.” Some actually say that they do not have to do anything because God’s grace has saved them and their actions have no bearing on that perceived reality.

The problem is reconciling such ideas with what is shown and demonstrated in God’s word. Grace is not freedom from effort, it makes it possible for our efforts toward God to actually make a difference in our eternal destination. Grace is an opportunity made possible only by God and His efforts, not ours. There is nothing we could do to bring this opportunity of grace to our lives. However, we can receive the blessings of God by taking advantage of the opportunity. Let us consider a Biblical example of how grace is not easy.

The Bible tells us that “Noah found favor (grace) in the eyes of the Lord” (Genesis 6:8). This grace that Noah found in the eyes of God was a divine opportunity. God had already decided that He was going to destroy man from the earth (v. 7). Such destruction would have included Noah and he would have deserved it because he was a man that had sinned (Romans 3:23). Yet, God’s grace gave Noah an opportunity to build an ark within the last 100 years of mankind in order to save himself and his family.

This grace that God provided to Noah was not easy in several ways. It was not easy physically. He had to build an enormous boat to precise specifications. It was not easy socially. He had to receive scorn from friends and neighbors because of the building of a large boat on dry land. In addition, his message that he preached concerning the

destruction that God was going to bring could not have been well received (2 Peter 2:5). It was not easy emotionally. I am sure that Noah was sad at the loss of friends, family, his way of life, and the immensity of the destruction on mankind. It was not easy on his patience. To remain within the ark for over a year with the same eight people and a plethora of animals must have been more than a little trying on his nerves. Grace saved Noah, but it was not easy.

Today, it is no different. Men have found “grace in the eyes of the Lord” through Jesus Christ. That grace is an opportunity to do something that will bring about their salvation. Hebrew 11:7 states that Noah’s preparing the ark brought about his salvation. We must build lives of obedience to God in order to bring about our salvation. An opportunity provided by God, but not an easy one.


