The "One Another" Directive

The phrase "one another" occurs some 56 times in the instructive epistles of the New Testament, with the vast majority of those occurrences applying to the relationships of Christians within the church. We are told to "love one another" (1 John 3:11), "admonish one another" (Romans 15:14), "serve one another" (Galatians 5:13), "bear one another's burdens" (Galatians 6:2), "be kind to one another" (Ephesians 4:32), "forgive one another" (Colossians 3:13), and "consider one another" (Hebrews 10:24), just to name a few of the many things that God says that we should do toward one another. In a world that seems to be becoming more and more egocentric by the day, and in which "church" has so often been reduced to nothing more than a weekly meeting, I am afraid that God's design for a "one another" church is in danger of being completely lost.

When Jesus prayed for the church on the night before His death, He prayed that we might be "one," just as He and the Father are one (John 17:20-21). That oneness that Jesus prayed for involves much more than just agreeing on matters of doctrine and practice. It involves the joining of the hearts, souls, and lives of those who belong to God in Christ. When I think of two separate lives becoming one, I naturally think of the marriage bond. While there are obviously some differences in this comparison, I believe that there are also some similarities in the way that God desires for us to see and consider our fellow Christians—to love, cherish, and value them, to always have their best interest in mind, to be patient, forgiving, and supportive of them, and to put their needs above our own. All of these commands, and more, are made to the church. In its earliest days, the church seems to have understood this (see Acts 2:42-47).

As we strive to be faithful to God in our lives and carry out the work of the church, may we never lose sight of the importance of "one another."


