On Wednesday night we began a new series in our CPYG Bible Class called *The New You*. The series is based off of Robert Hatfield's book, *The New You*, which is a great resource for new converts. In our first class we discussed four things a Christian is always to remember in their journey with God.

1. The Bible is God's Word. The Bible has withstood the test of time. There have been many who try to refute it, put it to the test, deny it, and yet it still stands firm. With 66 books and approximately 40 writers you would think that an error or contradiction could be found within the Bible. Yet we find complete unity throughout the text and its writers. 2 Peter 1:20-21 reveals to us that it was the Holy Spirit that guided these writers towards complete unity and understanding as God's holy word was being written. 2 Timothy 3:16 tells us that the "...Scripture is *breathed out by God*...". Therefore the Bible is complete and given for our understanding of God's will.
2. Truth is truth... no matter what. In the letters to Timothy, Paul warned Timothy that the church at Ephesus had been plagued by false teachers presenting a different doctrine (1 Timothy 1:3-4). Throughout life we have seen and heard of people twisting the scriptures in order to fit their agenda or lifestyle. The problem that comes about is confusion, misunderstanding and abuse of God's authority. God's word is perfect and complete. John 17:17 says, "*Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth.*"
3. Your relationship with Christ is more important than any other relationship in your life. When you became a Christian you made a commitment that is to last a lifetime. This commitment is renewed each day in your confession of faith. The relationship between Christ and the church is comparable to that of a husband and wife in Ephesians 5. A relationship that is loving, sacrificial, encouraging and committed. Jesus is to come above all other things in this world. Therefore, be active in the church, attend every worship service, praise God, speak to Him throughout the day in prayer. Matthew 10:37 tells us if any other relationship is above Him, then we are not worthy of Him.
4. Nothing or no one can make you quit... only you. Romans 8:35-39 tells us that there is nothing that can separate us from the love of God. The only exception is you. This world has much to offer and can easily cause us to take our minds off our commitment and priority to serve the Lord. There may even be storms, struggles, and tragedies that take place in our life. Whatever happens in this life, just remember there is an eternal home that awaits with God. Don't ever give up nor allow a struggle or worldly pleasure to take your focus from Heaven.

These 4 reminders are beneficial to the youngest Christian to the oldest Christian. The truth is we all need to be reminded of who we are; the precious relationship that Christ shares with the church. I hope to see you on Sunday where we will once again worship our God and edify one another.
