

THEME for 2022: COMPELLED 2 Corinthians 5: 14-15

Where Is My Focus

It is difficult to hit a target that I don't focus on. Whether that is a target that I am aiming an arrow at, or a goal in my life. If I don't focus on it, I will not achieve it. As people of God, we can not grow spiritually if we do not place focus on spiritual things.

Our lives are busy, and it is easy to lose track of important things while we are dealing with the urgent ones. It takes discipline for us to keep our focus on the important things, but it can be done. Paul reminded the church at Colossae that our focus needs to be on heavenly things.

Colossians 3:1-2. *"Therefore if you have been raised up with Christ, keep seeking the things above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ²Set your mind on the things above, not on the things that are on earth."*

There are many valuable lessons that we can learn from sports. We see that the best players in basketball, football, and tennis will try to disguise what they are trying to do so that the defender is caught off-guard or is defending against something that doesn't happen. A good army does the same.

Our opponent, the devil, deceives us into fighting the battles of the world, rather than keeping our focus on our spiritual fight. If we properly focus on the target, the distractions will not capture our attention. But we must work at it.

Your daily schedule may be working against you in this goal. It may need to be trimmed of some activities so that you have time to spend focusing on God's word. While it's never too late to start, it's also never too early. The devil will whisper that you can do it later. Don't postpone changes that need to be made.

Matthew 6:25-26. *"²⁵For this reason I say to you, do not be worried about your life, as to what you will eat or what you will drink; nor for your body, as to what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? ²⁶Look at the birds of the air, that they do not sow, nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth much more than they?"*

God is focused on us and our needs. That should give us a sense of comfort.

Matthew 6:31-33 *"³¹Do not worry then, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear for clothing?' ³²For the Gentiles eagerly seek all these things; for your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. ³³But seek first His kingdom and His righteousness, and all these things will be added to you."*

As you begin this new week, where is your focus? Focus on things above.
