**Cancelled** on Saturday, January 22, 2022 in order to keep our members safe due to the continued rise in the number of COVID cases.

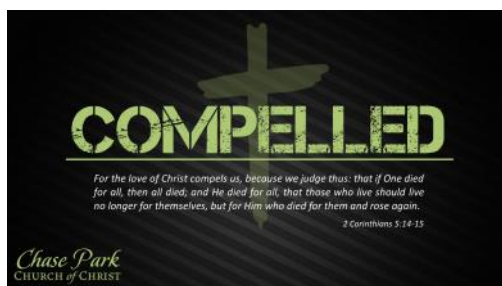

## What Are You Afraid Of?

What are you afraid of? Spiders? Snakes? Heights? The dark? I guess we all have those things that make us nervous, uncomfortable, or downright scared. How do those fears affect your daily life? Do they impact your decision making or hinder your day to day activities? Some probably have a minimal impact if any at all while others might severely affect your routines and choices. Fear is not a bad thing. It is a God-given emotion provided for our protection and self-preservation, and in most cases, we should heed its warnings, but we must remember that fear is to have its limits. Consider Jesus' words in Matthew 10:28:

*“And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul.  
But rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell.”*

Now do not misunderstand what Jesus is teaching. He is not suggesting that we should live our lives in a foolhardy manner or throw caution to the wind. God desires for us to live wisely in this world and to make our decisions with prudence and care. However, what Jesus is teaching is that there are some things that are to be feared more than even death. Throughout the ages, Christians have been asked to stare death in the face while maintaining their faithfulness and obedience to God. Thankfully, you and I do not have to make that choice because of persecution, but the principle is still true for us. Knowing that we will all stand before God someday to give account of our lives, if our choice comes down to spiritual faithfulness or physical security and we cannot have both, we are to choose faithfulness. There is nothing—not even life itself—that is more precious or valuable than our soul and its salvation. May we have the courage to always put our relationship with God first.
