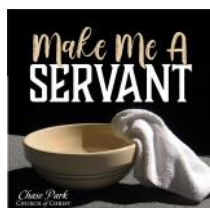

## How Do You See Yourself?

Are you a body that has a soul or a soul that has a body? At first glance, these two options may seem to be synonymous, but in reality they are opposites, and the one that we choose to believe will determine who we are and how we live.

You see, the majority of people, including many Christians, see themselves as physical beings who happen to have a soul. They are, at least in the here and now, primarily physical in nature but understand that there is an unseen and imperceptible part of them that is spiritual and eternal. The problem with this mindset is that it defines us and our purpose as primarily physical and worldly. Therefore, what matters most is what the body wants and needs, often to the neglect of spiritual needs and goals. We easily justify our desires as necessary for our happiness and well-being with little regard for the spiritual implications of those choices. After all, we reason, we are mainly physical.

“So God created man in His own image, in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them” (Gen. 1:27). God did not create us to be bodies with souls. He created us as souls that have bodies. We are made in His image—an eternal, spiritual soul created in the form and likeness of God. He then clothed that soul with a temporary vessel or dwelling place. We are primarily spiritual in nature. That is God’s design and purpose for us. That’s how He sees us and how He desires for us to see ourselves. If we view ourselves as primarily spiritual, then our spiritual health, well-being, and growth becomes more important to us than the worldly desires of our flesh. In this mindset, the will of God takes priority over our own will and pleasing Him becomes our constant aim and desire.

So how do you see yourself? Are you a body that has a soul, or a soul that has a body? It is an important distinction that will define how you live your life. May we all strive to see ourselves as God sees us and truly live as God’s children in this world.
