What Does God Look Like?

A Bible class teacher noticed one of her students diligently working on something during Bible class on Sunday. "Johnny, what are you working on so hard?" she asked.

- "I'm drawing a picture of God," he replied.
- "That's great," the teacher said, "but no one knows what God looks like."
- "Well, they will when I'm finished!" he exclaimed.

You know, in a sense, we are all called to draw a picture of God—not with a pencil and paper but with our lives. As God's children and people, we are to draw and color a picture of God for all the world to see. We produce this picture with our love, compassion, mercy, and godly conduct. Thus, Jesus teaches us in Matthew 5:16 to "let your light so shine before men that they may see your good works and glorify your Father who is in heaven." They glorify our Father because they see and recognize Him through our lives.

That is not to say that we are capable of perfectly emulating the characteristics of God. We are not and cannot be God. What we create with our lives is an imperfect picture of a perfect God. Our purpose is not to recreate God but rather to point people to Him by helping them to see His goodness in our lives. Think of it this way: a well-made photograph of a beautiful place does not serve to give the experience of being in that place but rather to instill a desire to go there. In the same way, a godly life gives the world a glimpse of the transcendent glory and goodness of God with the intent of creating in them a desire to have a relationship with Him.

Being an ambassador for God is a daunting and challenging task. It requires our commitment and desire. So here's the question: What kind of picture are we painting of God? You see, as God's people, we ARE showing the world a picture of God. The question is, do they see in our lives, a God who is sincere, loving, faithful, compassionate, and holy? May we always let our lights shine in such a way that the world sees and glorifies Him.
