## Never Alone

The writer of Hebrews wrote the book to Jewish Christians in an attempt to persuade them not to give up their faith in Christ because of hardship or persecution. At the conclusion of the book in chapter 13, the writer lists several practical concluding remarks.

Hebrews 13:1-2. Let love of the brethren continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by this some have entertained angels without knowing it. Both of these are ways that we as followers of Christ are able to help others to know that they are not forgotten; they are not alone.

Verse 3 reminds that we are to care for those in prison.

And in verses 5-7, there is a reminder that we must not trust in ourselves but rely upon God. He can be relied on to meet our needs. Make sure that your character is free from the love of money, being content with what you have; for He Himself has said, *"I will never desert you, nor will I ever forsake you,"* so that we confidently say, *"The Lord is my helper, I will not be afraid. What will man do to me?"* Remember those who led you, who spoke the word of God to you; and considering the result of their conduct, imitate their faith. *"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever."*

There are times in life when it seems like we are on our own. It seems like we have no one to rely on. But the word of God tells us that this is not so.

-Psalm 147:11. The Lord favors those who fear Him, those who wait for His lovingkindness.

-Isaiah 30:18. Therefore the Lord longs to be gracious to you, and therefore He waits on high to have compassion on you. For the Lord is a God of justice; How blessed are all those who long for Him.

-Isaiah 40:31 Yet those who wait for the Lord will gain new strength; they will mount up *with* wings like eagles, they will run and not get tired, they will walk and not become weary.

And we must not forget that Jesus promised His disciples, who we are, that He would be with us always.

Matthew 28:19-20. *"Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit teaching them to observe all that I commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age."*

As Jesus disciples we are given the task of serving one another in times of hardship; to bear one another's burdens. In whatever way we serve, Christ is with us. We are never alone.
