Baby Shower

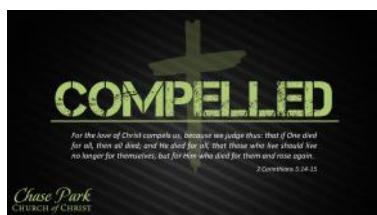
