

We Need Help!

I read somewhere one time that if you ever see a turtle sitting on top of a fence post, there is one thing that you can know for sure: he had some help getting there. Just as a turtle can't get to the top of a fence post without help, you and I can't make it through this life without help. By any estimation, life in this world is sometimes difficult. We all face the occasional challenges of life—sickness, sorrow, and hardships of different kinds. Then there are the challenges of being faithful to God in this life. We have an adversary in Satan who daily places temptations and trials before us in a constant attempt to deceive, discourage, and defeat us. As we face these difficulties in life, we need help. Certainly, we need the loving help of God to protect, provide for, and sustain us, but we also need the help of those around us to encourage us and to give us the strength to do what we can't do alone.

In Exodus 17, we find the story of the battle between the Children of Israel and the Amalekites. As Joshua led the armies of Israel into battle, Moses stood on a hill overlooking the battleground. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel prevailed, but if he dropped his arms, the Amalekites would begin to win the battle. When Moses became tired and could no longer hold his arms up, Aaron and Hur found a stone for Moses to sit on and then stood on either side of him and supported his arms until the sun went down and Israel had won the battle. Together, Moses, Joshua, Aaron, and Hur did what none of them could have done alone (see Exodus 17:8-13).

Much like Joshua needed the help of Moses, and Moses needed the help of Aaron and Hur, as we strive to live godly lives and inherit our home in heaven, we need the help of those around us—fellow Christians who love and care for us and who understand our struggle because they are striving for the same eternal prize. We need their encouragement and strength, and they need ours. So, *“let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works”* (Hebrews 10:24). Resolve to be a helper—look for opportunities to strengthen and encourage your brothers and sisters and allow them to help you, too, so that, together and with God's help, we can accomplish great things for Christ—things that we could never do alone.
