Physical Life, Spiritual Mind

One of the greatest challenges that we face as Christians is the challenge of being spiritually-minded. After all, we are clothed in physical bodies and live in a physical world. Everything that we know from an experiential point of view is physical. And so, it stands to reason that our mindsets, goals, desires, and yes, our fears and insecurities have a tendency to follow a physical path. We work to acquire the physical, we hope and trust in the physical, and we fret and worry about the physical. It is our natural reaction to a physical existence.

But God has called us to an immensely better and more permanent life—a life in which the treasure that we store up is never in danger of being stolen or destroyed (Matt. 6:19-21). That life is one in which we do not worry about our needs but seek God's kingdom first and trust in Him to provide (Matt. 6:25-34). It is a life in which we need not fret about the future but rest in the assurance and anticipation of a mansion in heaven that our Lord has gone to prepare for us (John 14:1-3). Thankfully, God does not make us wait until eternity to start enjoying the security of His spiritual blessings. No, He has given us the ability to enjoy the hope (Heb. 6:19), peace (Phil. 4:6-7), and joy (1 Thess. 5:16) that come through a relationship with Him, even in this life.

How do we find those things in the here and now? How do we escape the insecurity of this physical world and find the comfort and security of God's perfect care? By transforming our minds (Rom. 12:2)! By understanding that all the things that this world has to offer, as enjoyable and convenient as they might be, are temporary at best and do not offer the permanent security that we truly desire. By acknowledging that we are, in reality, spiritual beings, and that our true home is with God in heaven. And by placing the focus of our lives, trust, and hope squarely upon God, making Him our first and greatest priority.
