## What Is Your Calling?

The word “calling” is a word that we do not use much in the world because of the incorrect way that much of the larger religious world has applied the concept, but it is a word and a concept that, when used properly, is both Scriptural and applicable to our lives as Christians today. First of all, we are all “called” to come out of the world and to give our lives to Christ, taking on His image and living with and for Him. Within that broader calling, we are each “called” to use the gifts, abilities, and opportunities that God has blessed us with to His glory and for His purposes. (Take a moment to read Romans 12:3-8.) So, what is your calling, and how are you answering it?

Consider a quick example from the apostles: they each had different personalities and different talents that made them useful in different ways. Many of them, we don’t know much about, but we know that Peter, for instance, was the one who would become the chief spokesperson for the apostles because of his natural boldness and outspokenness. John would have a special relationship with Jesus and would become known as “the apostle of love” because of his gentle spirit. Think though about Andrew, the brother of Peter and seemingly one of the “other” apostles. Yet, it seems that each time we see Andrew mentioned specifically in the gospel accounts, he is bringing someone to Jesus. He first brought His brother Peter to the Lord (John 1:40-42). In John’s record of the feeding of the 5,000, it is Andrew who brings the young boy with food to Jesus (John 6:8-9). When a group of Greeks came to Philip desiring to see Jesus, Philip brought them to Andrew who, in turn, brought them to Jesus (John 12:20-22). Isn’t it interesting that every time Andrew is mentioned outside the listings of the apostles, he is actively involved in pointing someone to Jesus? What a great example for Christians today! Andrew did not do anything that required any extraordinary ability or skill. He simply understood the importance of Jesus and took advantage of opportunities to share that understanding with others. That was his calling, and it is ours as well. While we may all carry it out in different ways, to share Jesus with others is our calling.



## Outreach—Pat Cowden

A few weeks ago I shared some thoughts from Neil Richey's *Church Growth: Growing the Church God Loves*. I wanted to take this opportunity to share some more thoughts from that book. These are some of his suggestions for helping church members to be involved in local work. (Which is the only "magic" there is to growing a congregation, numerically and spiritually- being connected and involved.)

1. Remind the members who they are: We do this by reminding them "Whose" they are. We are Christians, saved by grace through faith, by the blood of Christ. We are responsible to the Most High God, and we are called to serve Him every day, not just a select day (Sunday) of the week.
2. Set the bar HIGH! Expect great things from one another. We are, after all, God's chosen children. Shepherds must expect great things from their flock and hold their sheep accountable.
3. Have practical show-me-how classes. **Soul winning** classes followed up by **new convert** classes and **involvement** classes. Folks are often times zealous but need direction; we should give it to them.
4. Recognize talents, and put people to work where they are. We should not put a "babe in Christ" alone in a classroom as a teacher. We should not force a man who cannot carry a tune to lead singing. Not because the tune is so important but because we should not willingly cause someone embarrassment (unnecessarily shaming people is not a good motivator).
5. Help people want to "be like Jesus"! Jesus was involved! True or not true? When others see our lights shining through service, it fosters a desire to serve others and glorify God.

Evangelism challenge:

If you missed your OHM Team meeting, make plans to come the first opportunity you have. No body is going to be offended if you show up at their meeting. Invite a friend and come on.

Remember, I love you in the Lord and want to go to heaven with you.
