Does God Hear Me?

Have you ever wondered if God is hearing your prayers to Him? There is no doubt that God hears the prayers offered by His faithful children. God's answer to our prayer may come in several ways, not necessarily in the way we have in mind and may be expecting. We have a Father whose thoughts and ways are far above ours (**Isaiah 55:8-9**). It is truth that God knows better than us what is best for us and what is in accord with His will.

As we pray to our Father we must always be aware that we must **only be seeking those things that are in accord with His will**. We are constantly submitting ourselves to the Father's will as Christ did in the Garden of Gethsemane. This is a difficult task for many who live in a culture that is so self-centered. But if we subject ourselves to His will, we have an assurance from God, **1 John 5:14-15** – "14 And this is the boldness which we have toward him, that, if we ask anything according to his will, he heareth us: 15 and if we know that he heareth us whatsoever we ask, we know that we have the petitions which we have asked of him." Again, the position of the faithful Christian in prayer is to subject our desires to that of the Father. If we desire His will to be done and we ask something that is not in accord with His will, and He says No, then we in deed do have our petition.

As we approach God in prayer, we must also have **faith that God will answer** every proper petition sent to his throne. Always keep in mind that God's answer may differ from the one we may be expecting or desiring, but His answer is the best answer for us because of His love for us. **Matthew 7:9-11** tells us how earthly fathers seek to give their children good things, and emphasizes how much more our heavenly Father does the same. From these points we then conclude that the *äll things* mentioned by Jesus in **Matthew 21:22**, "And all things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive." where the great efficacy of prayer is affirmed, are also limited to the good of man and the will of God.

Our final point in this discussion is that **there must be an effort on man's part**. We must make an effort in regard to those things we are praying, not merely sit back and wait for God to make things happen. No valid conclusion can be made that God answers prayers as a substitute for human endeavor. As Christians we must strive for the most efficient service possible in doing the will of God.

Matthew 7:21 – "²¹Not every one that saith unto me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father who is in heaven."




