The “How To” Method of Sharing Christ

In Matthew 28:18-20, Jesus issues the Great Commission to his apostles and disciples. Go into all the world and teach the gospel to all. This is an important command and opportunity we have as Christians, but the question is how?

In Acts 17, we have a blueprint given to us in sharing the gospel with others. Read Acts 17:16-34. After reading, here are a few pointers concerning evangelism involving Paul and the people of Athens...

Verse 16... Paul studies the beliefs of the people of Athens.

Verse 17... Paul shares in conversations about his faith and listens to others' beliefs.

Verse 22... Paul commends the people of Athens for being very religious. (Finds a positive)

Verse 23... Paul finds an open door/opportunity to teach with the “unknown god” statue. (Common ground)

Verses 25-29... Paul shares his faith and provides evidence about the one true God. Includes how God is near to all of us. You can seek Him and find Him.

Verses 30-31... Paul teaches about the promise of eternity, repentance, and the Day of Judgement that is coming.

Verses 32-34... Response to the sharing of The Faith.

Too many times we think we don't know enough, are not good at speaking, are too nervous, etc., when it comes to evangelism. If you feel this way, I encourage you to practice the method Paul puts to practice in Acts 17. Let the Bible be your guide and give/share the Gospel of Christ in love.
