Why the Barnabas Project?

Last Sunday, I introduced a new outreach program which I have named the Barnabas Project. I wanted to explain the program a little more and why it is called what it is. We live in a time when interaction is limited, more so than any other period certainly in my lifetime. With that isolation comes feelings of loneliness, unrest, and depression for some. We, as God's children, know that without God in their lives, people are truly alone. So, when we become aware of someone in our community who is suffering and connected to one or more of our members, we want them to know they are not alone.

Jesus embodied the trait of compassion. The New Testament is filled with accounts of Jesus showing compassion; it was a natural part of His character. The same thing, apparently, was true about Josos, whom the apostles renamed, Barnabas (Acts 4:36). Barnabas' character was so infused with compassion and encouragement that it was like it was part of his genetic makeup. Almost like he could not resist being compassionate and encouraging. His renaming by the apostles was a sign of respect and honor from those godly men.

We should choose to be like Barnabas who imitated Christ in this attribute as Paul instructed (1 Corinthians 11:1). The lesson for us is this: our lives should be identified so much with caring, kindness, and compassion, that God looks at us like the apostles looked at Barnabas.

We want to surround these suffering people with love, eventually desiring to share the ultimate gift of the gospel with them, so that they will truly never have to feel alone again. Intentional compassion indicates thoughtfulness on the part of the one showing the encouragement, and nobody wants to feel forgotten. Jesus said to treat others like we would like to be treated, this is a purposeful way to do just that.

I love you and remember I want to go to heaven with you.
