Developing a Deeper Love for the Lost

This past Wednesday, during the Bible class hour and devotion period, I spoke about developing a deeper love for the lost. One of the reasons I titled it, “*Developing A Deeper Love for the Lost,*” is because loving those who are lost does not necessarily come naturally or easily to us. It is counterintuitive. We know we are supposed to love God and His people and that is not terribly difficult for us. We know we are supposed to love righteousness and meditate on good things (Philippians 4:8), and that comes easily as well. But, loving someone who is completely different, who doesn’t have the same lifestyle, or understanding, or life and eternal goals? Perhaps they don’t care about God at all. Yes, that does not come naturally, and yet, God tells us we must.

So, what does that involve and how do we do it? We must do as Paul did. In order to fulfill this command; we must imitate Christ - 1 Corinthians 11:1:

- Christ was compassionate, we must be compassionate.
- Christ was remorseful (not over His own sins, but the sins of others), we must be remorseful over our own sins and the sins of others.
- Christ was empathetic, we must be empathetic.
- Christ was forgiving, we must be forgiving.
- Christ was patient, we must be patient.
- Christ was loving, we must be loving.
- Christ was concerned about the lost, we must be concerned about the lost.

If we strive to imitate Christ in all areas of our lives, loving the lost will come more naturally. If anyone ever had the right to not love the lost, if would have been Christ, because we put Him on a cross. And yet, while we (you and I) were yet sinners, Christ died for us (loved us) (Romans 5:8).

Remember, I love you and want to go to heaven with you.
