Add To Your Virtue Knowledge...

"But also for this very reason, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue, to virtue knowledge, to knowledge self-control, to self-control perseverance, to perseverance godliness, to godliness brotherly kindness, and to brotherly kindness love. For if these things are yours and abound, you will be neither barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ."

2 Peter 1:5-8

As we continue to grow and develop in our spiritual lives, we must strive to add knowledge to our faith and virtue. Knowledge obviously refers to our knowledge of God, His redemptive work in Christ, and His will for our lives. Some might wonder why knowledge is not the first item on this list instead of falling behind faith and virtue. After all, is knowledge not required in order to have faith? But, in fact, Peter has already mentioned the knowledge of Christ that has been delivered to them (verse 3) and that has given birth to their faith. That faith should, in turn, cause them to turn away from the more obvious impurities and improprieties of the world, leading to a virtuous life. We all know people who have some degree of faith in God and who live virtuous lives but who are not faithful Christians because they lack the knowledge of God's word that allows them to be fully obedient. If they, and we, are to continue to grow toward spiritual maturity and faithfulness, we must pursue a deeper knowledge of God and understanding of His will.

Obviously, the key to knowledge is the Word of God. Given by inspiration through His Spirit, God's Word is "profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16-17). As we spend time in reading and studying God's Word, we grow in our faith, in our virtue, and in our knowledge, and we become better equipped to serve God and to live faithfully in this world. The key to gaining knowledge is in understanding that it does not happen accidentally. We must desire it and pursue it. We must devote time, effort, and energy to its acquisition. In the words of the wise man, "Yes, if you cry out for discernment, and lift up your voice for understanding, if you seek her as silver, and search for her as for hidden treasures; then you will understand the fear of the Lord, and find the knowledge of God" (Proverbs 2:3-5). May we always seek after God and continually add knowledge to our virtue.

Seek God's Wisdom—Nathan Adams

The first chapter in James has a general focus upon God's wisdom in His word of truth which is the perfect law of liberty (vs. 5,18, 21, 25). Four times in James 1, the writer points his readers to the word of God. It makes all the difference. The difference between being able to consider our trials with joy in order to obtain endurance and maturity and being tossed around by our circumstances is God's word (vs. 2-8). God's word is also that which makes the difference between the glory that comes through humility and the fading destruction of worldly vanity (vs. 9-11). Whether a difficulty is a trial or a temptation will be decided by what is within a man. If lust is in his heart, he will be enticed and it will give birth to sin. On the other hand, if it is God's word, it will bring forth a new creation in God (vs. 12-18; 2 Corinthians 5:17; John 3:5). The way to not act impulsively in word and deed is to be ready to

hear and implant God's word which is able to save your soul (vs. 19-21). The way to insure that you not only hear the word, but also do what it commands is by looking "intently at the perfect law" and abiding by it (vs. 22-25). Being that doer of the word is what enables one to have "pure and undefiled religion in the sight of our God and Father" (vs. 26-27). The remainder of the book is focused on how to do those things that helps others and keeps us unstained by the world.

As we consider this profound focus on God's word by James, let's go back and consider James 1:5. James states, "But if any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all generously and without reproach, and it will be given to him." Our first inclination is to apply this verse to prayer and it is true that prayer is a manner in which we ask God for what we need. However, prayer is never

specifically mentioned and the word "ask" also carries the idea to simply "seek" something. Based on the context, it would seem more likely that James is pointing Christians to God's wisdom which is found in His word. It is to seek wisdom in truth by asking, "What does God say?" James goes on to make it clear that if a person wants this wisdom, it is available to all. No one is excluded from the ability to learn God's word. It is given generously (Matthew 5:6). It has everything we need for our spiritual and physical lives (2 Peter God will never reprimand (reproach) or criticize the person honestly seeking wisdom from His word.

May we seek or ask for God's wisdom by looking intently at His perfect law of liberty, implanting it in our hearts, living it in our lives, using it to overcome temptations, and allowing it to save our souls.

Reading for October 2 - 8: Titus; Philemon

Titus and Philemon are the other two of Paul's personal letters that have been preserved for us. Much like Timothy, Titus was a fellow minister and young protégé of Paul who needed instruction and encouragement, which Paul provides. Philemon, on the other hand, seems to have been a personal friend of Paul's and respected Christian who was facing a difficult situation. Paul lovingly counsels him and encourages him to act in love toward his new brother Onesimus. As you read and study this week, consider:

- What can we learn from Paul's letter to Titus about God's design and desire for the church?
- Are there lessons that we can learn from Philemon that are applicable to our modern world and culture?
