## What Is An Ebenezer?

Have you ever asked yourself this question? If you are like me, the first thing (and maybe the only thing) that comes to mind when you hear the word “Ebenezer” is the grumpy, money-loving character, Ebenezer Scrooge, from Charles Dickens’ “A Christmas Carol.” So, it seems very strange to many that, in the hymn, “O Thou Fount of Every Blessing,” we find these words in verse 2:

*Here I raise my Ebenezer: Hither by Thy help I’ve come;*

While the language of this entire song, written in 1758, is somewhat antiquated, the concept of “raising my Ebenezer” is one that is completely foreign to many. So, what is an Ebenezer, and why would I want to raise it?

The term “Ebenezer” comes from a Biblical text found in 1 Samuel. In chapter 4, the Israelites are encamped in a place called Ebenezer, preparing to go into battle against the Philistines. After being defeated by the Philistines, they call for the ark of God to be brought in among them so that they might be victorious. It is brought from Shiloh to Ebenezer, accompanied by Hophni and Phinehas, the two wicked sons of Eli. In the subsequent battle, the Israelites are slaughtered, Hophni and Phinehas are killed, and the ark of God is taken by the Philistines.

In chapters 5-7 of 1 Samuel, we find that God causes plagues to come upon the Philistines because they have taken the ark of God and, after seven months, they return the ark to the Israelites. Samuel, the prophet of God and judge of Israel, tells the people of Israel to repent and turn from the foreign gods that they have accepted so that God might forgive them and be with them once again. In response, the Israelites gather together at Mizpah for a period of prayer and fasting in repentance of their sins. When the Philistines hear of the Israelites being gathered in Mizpah, they plan another attack, but Samuel petitions God for deliverance and the Israelites, with God’s help, turn back the attack of the Philistines and overcome them. To commemorate that victory, Samuel sets up a stone as a monument, calling its name “Ebenezer” and saying, “Thus far the Lord has helped us.” The word Ebenezer literally means, “stone of help” and was a reminder to the Israelites of God’s mercy and forgiveness, as well as His help in giving them victory.

As we sing the words, “Here I raise my Ebenezer,” we are following after the example of Samuel in acknowledging God’s mercy, forgiveness, grace, and help and recognizing that it is only by His grace that we have come to where we are. So, the next time we sing that song, sing those words joyfully, with understanding and thanksgiving!

## Lamifications—*Andrew Lamica*

Our bodies are amazing creations by God. There are so many attributes of our bodies which clearly show a designer. Things like the complexity of the human eye all the way to our DNA.

One of the things I want us to consider that is part of our make up is the fight or flight instinct we have. *Fight or flight* is an instinct that kicks in when we are faced with a perilous situation. It is in these situations that we make the decision to fight against whatever the danger is or run from it. Once the instinct kicks, when the dangerous situation is faced, a decision is made.

Thinking about this idea of *fight or flight* caused me to think about the perilous spiritual situations we sometimes find ourselves in. It caused me to wonder if God wants

us to *fight or flight* when we are faced with the different trials and temptations. The answer is yes! God gives us instructions on both *fight AND flight* when it comes to spiritual temptation. Consider what James writes in James 4:7 “*Submit yourselves, therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you.*” There are times in our lives when we will literally have to *fight* against the wiles of Satan. Make no mistake about it, it will be a fight and eternity hangs in the balance! Fight with everything you have, fight by submitting yourself to God. Christians, when Satan comes, be prepared to fight, and remember, you are not fighting alone, God is on your side and so is your Christian family!

What about *flight*? Is it ever

appropriate to flee instead of fight against the wiles of Satan? Yes! Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 10:13, “*No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and He will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation He will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.*” God provides us a way of escape from temptation which means we can *flee* from them!

Christians, fight temptations when they come! Christians run far away from temptation when they come. Let each of us strive to be the type of people that we ought to be when Satan’s snares come our way!
