## Fear of Our “Assyrians beyond the River”

The ancient Assyrians were the “superpower” in the world in the years that they had conquered the Middle East (744-612 BC.) They were merciless conquerors and their defeated rivals often were taken as slaves. Eventually, the Assyrians conquered and subjugated the Israelites, as God prophesied. (Isaiah 8:7-8, 11:16, 20:4-6. John uses symbolic language in Revelation 9 and 16 to describe a terrible threat from the east of the River Euphrates. For hundreds of years, the Israelites had continuing threats and subjugation from the Assyrians, then the Babylonians, and finally the Persians. The threat from “beyond the river” was a real fear for many of them.

We have many of the same fears, but from many sources. Instead of a terrifying conquering country as a threat, we have many less clear, but dangerous foes. These include insecurity, loneliness, inner fears and worries, and many individual fears and concerns. Fortunately, our Lord has given us the cure and comfort from Scripture on how to confront and defeat these fears.

Some of the better known are:

Joshua 1:9; 2 Corinthians 1:3-4; Matthew 11:28-30; Psalm 27:1; Philippians 4:6-7; and the well known and loved, Psalm 23:4: *“Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil, for You are with me; Your rod and Your staff, they comfort me.”*

The Lord understands our needs. We need to completely trust and depend upon Him.
