Who is Working in Your Life?

Rusty had a great lesson on the challenging topic of God's Providential Workings in our lives. As he pointed out, it is not always easy to see how and when God is working in our lives, but as we look back in time, we are confident that He was playing an important role in our lives.

Somewhat related, and perhaps overlapping, is the question posed today. Who is working in your life? Is it God? Is it Satan? We might quickly reply, "God" in view of our study on providence, and hopefully that is correct for each of us. But, for the purpose of this article, let's consider both as the correct answer to the question.

Satan has, as his main goal, to destroy God's people. Of this we are assured by Peter when he penned, "...*your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walks about, seeking whom he may devour...*" (1 Peter 5:8.) We must have a clear understanding in our minds of Satan going throughout the day with nothing more important to him than to destroy God's children. Through his tempting, deceiving ways, he is constantly trying to overpower the Christian and pull him or her away from God for all eternity.

Along with the realization that Satan is working in our lives to destroy our spiritual lives for all eternity, God is working as well to preserve us. Pause now, and every day, to remember and be uplifted and encouraged by the promise of God that He will be there for us. Through our obedience to God's word, we have a "promise from God" that we will have a home in heaven, and we know that Christ has gone to prepare that place just for us.

While Satan has pulled the majority of people into his way of thinking and acting, those who choose to follow God have so many blessings. They have blessings right now, such as the comfort that comes from knowing and doing what is right, the feeling that comes to you from giving true love, and the inner peace that is given to the faithful. Then consider the blessings for all eternity; no more tears, no pain, no sorrow, being in the presence of God, and on and on.

As we consider these thoughts, the question for us changes from "Who is working in your life?" to "Who is leading your life?" Read and see if Colossians 3:1-4 expresses your heart's desire.
