
Library News

Accepting the LORD'S Call...

This past week our family has been reading the book of Luke. In chapter 1 we have the announcement of John the Baptist's and Jesus' impending births. In regard to Jesus' birth announcement, I want to focus on Mary's response. In Luke 1:26-33, the angel Gabriel reveals to the Virgin Mary that she will be the mother of Jesus. At first, Mary is startled to see and receive such a visit from an angel. Once the plan is revealed to her, the only question she asks is found in verse 34, citing her being a virgin. Yet the angel answers her lone question in verses 35-37. After the explanation, notice Mary's response, "**38** Then Mary said, 'Behold the maidservant of the Lord! Let it be to me according to your word.' And the angel departed from her." (Luke 2:38).

"Lord, let it be... ." This was the response Mary gives to the LORD. Scholars believe that Mary was likely 15-18 years of age at the time of this announcement. Given her age, virginity, unmarried status, commoner, etc., it seems that this announcement and plan of Jesus would be a difficult one to accept. I'm sure there were those in the community who scoffed, ridiculed, and misunderstood. Yet in verses 46-55, Mary continues her acceptance by magnifying the Lord and remembering the promise given to His people.

Mary would go on to be the mother of Jesus. She would love Him all of her days. She would raise the prophesied Messiah. She was accepting of the Lord's call. Mary is a great example of faith for us to look to today as Christians. When the Lord gives us instructions or opens a door for us our attitude should be like Mary's. "Lord, let it be... ."
