#### Did You Know?

Do you remember the scene from the Old Testament when the great prophet Elijah is taken up to heaven in a chariot of fire? Are you sure? It is, no doubt, an incredible event as Elijah becomes one of only two men to not experience death. However, contrary to what is often taught or understood about this story, Elijah was not taken to heaven in a chariot of fire. In 2 Kings 2:11, we are clearly told that the chariot of fire served the purpose of separating Elijah from Elisha and that Elijah was taken up in a whirlwind.

How about this one—how many wise men came to worship Jesus after His birth and where did they find Him? Almost without fail, every depiction and telling of this story will show three wise men standing before the baby Jesus in a manger. However, a quick look at Scripture reveals that we are not told how many wise men came seeking Jesus, only that they brought three gifts. We are also clearly told that they found Jesus in a "house," not in a stable (see Matthew 2:1-12).

What's the point of all this? Simply this: sometimes, everything that you thought you knew about some portion of Scripture can turn out to be wrong. Sometimes, we are more influenced by tradition or popular understanding than we are the revealed truth of Scripture. While the examples given earlier might be somewhat trivial and have no real spiritual consequences, there are other matters of grave importance that are greatly misconstrued as being Biblical truth when they are not. Popular doctrines such as once saved, always saved, the sinner's prayer, predestination, and the rapture are just a few examples of very well-known and often accepted beliefs that have no basis in Scripture. Did you know that not a single person in the New Testament was ever saved by saying the sinner's prayer? Were you aware that the Bible clearly teaches that a person can forfeit their salvation?

As people who desire to be obedient and pleasing to God in our lives, it is crucial that we be diligent students of God's Word and that we never simply settle for man's teaching as a substitute for our own searching of the Scriptures. May God grant us wisdom as we seek out His will.


