## Outreach News—Pat Cowden

The interaction with Jesus and the Samaritan woman at the well (John 4:3-42) is a wonderful example of how a normal event can result in eternal benefits. This was a day like many other days, a woman going to a well to draw water and a man, Jesus, asks her for a drink. She has no idea who he is, except that he is a Jew and she is a Samaritan who normally would have nothing to do with each other.

At this point Jesus brings up a spiritual topic, the living water that He had to offer. She was not real sure what Jesus was talking about confusing what Jesus was saying with physical water, rather than words that would lead to everlasting life.

Once she knows that Jesus is talking about spiritual things, she asks for some and Jesus brings up her husband. The Samaritan woman acknowledges that she has no husband and Jesus proves to her that He was different because He knew things about her He could not have known. At this point, the conversation becomes overtly religious talking about worshipping God in spirit and truth (v. 24).

This is a wonderful example of how our every day conversations can be turned into an opportunity to reach people for Christ. In this case, not just the woman was reached but eventually many of the Samaritans believed in and came to know that He was indeed the Christ, the Savior of the world (v. 42).

Evangelism challenge:

The Holiday season is a time when many people are lonely and in need of some companionship. This is also a time when those who are outside of Christ might be thinking about Him. Now is a great time to reach out to someone with the one thing that will truly last, the word of God that is able to save their souls.

Remember, I love you in the Lord and want to go to heaven with you.
