Deep Faith In A Shallow World—Daniel 4—Nathan Adams

When we go to the doctor, we want them to tell us the truth about what is happening with our health. It is only through truthfulness that we can seek the appropriate treatment or cure. Too often, Christians do not provide the truth when the world seeks it. In Daniel 4 (READ), we see how Daniel's deep faith responded to the world's call for truth. Daniel shows us four necessary traits we must possess in order to effectively provide the truth to the world.

First, we must have CREDIBI -LITY. Daniel had established credibi lity by the manner in which he had served Nebuchadnezzar. Verse 8 tells us that the king recognized Daniel's unique abilities from God. Unlike the dream of Chapter 2, the king did not threaten to kill all the wise men, instead he looked to Daniel for the truth. Our credibility is established by the life we live and the things we say long before the world comes asking us for truth. Our credibility must also have a strong foundation in the word of God because it is the truth that the world needs to hear.

Second. we must have CONCERN. You have heard the saying, "they don't care how much you know until they know how much you In verse 19, it is clear that care." Daniel was concerned for Nebuchadnezzar's future. He could have reasoned that the pagan king was going to finally get what he deserved. While that may have been true, Daniel cared. In the same way, God cared about us when we deserved to be lost because of our sinful ways. We will never be effective truth-givers until we care about those who need truth.

Third, a Christian must have CANDOR. Candor is forthright honesty. When there is a need for truth, there will be those who are not living according to it. It is hard to tell people that the manner in which they are living needs to change. Yet, if we are to help them with their greatest need—they must be told. The message Daniel gave the king was a hard one. Likewise, our truth telling will sometimes be hard for the world to hear.

Fourth, the truth-teller must offer CORRECTION. It is not enough to simply tell someone that they are living wrong, we need to tell them how to live right. Daniel told the king, "*Break away now from your sins and do righteousness*" (v. 27). The correcting of those who need truth is a product of our concern for their souls. Truth without change is worthless to a person. Anytime we tell someone the truth from God, it must be with the motivation of seeing that person conform to that truth.

There was a deadly train crash caused because a red flag that would have made it clear to stop had faded to yellow. Since it looked yellow, the train did not stop and it cost many people their lives. The message was unclear. When the world calls for truth, our message must be clear. It must be presented with concern, candor, and accompanied by correction. Anything else will cost people their souls.
