Just A Vapor

Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, spend a year there, buy and sell, and make a profit"; whereas you do not know what will happen tomorrow. For what is your life? It is even a vapor that appears for a little time and then vanishes away. Instead you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we shall live and do this or that." (James 4:13-15)

September is the month that we typically begin the process of planning for the next year. Theme, calendar, Summer Series, special days—there is a lot that goes into that planning process. As we begin that work each year, I am always reminded of the passage of Scripture above. Despite all of our planning and preparation, there is no guarantee of tomorrow. Life in this world, at its very best, is short and uncertain. These verses do not tell us not to plan, but rather to plan with the understanding that God is in control and not us. While our view of our own lives is very limited and often flawed, God’s is complete and perfect. Instead of depending on our own wisdom, we must learn to trust in the wisdom and will of God.

Things will not always go as planned in this world. There will be unexpected events, setbacks, and disappointments. That truth is unsettling for us, which is why we tend to try to control our lives through planning and preparation. Thankfully, our days are not at the mercy of chance, coincidence, luck, or even our own imperfect efforts. Instead, we belong to a God who watches over our lives with wisdom, care, and power to lead us in the right paths and to walk with us through the dark times, ensuring us that “all things work together for good...” (Romans 8:28) As a father watches over his child with love and concern for the child’s well-being, so our heavenly Father watches over us, providing for our needs and protecting us from the undue attacks of our enemy. So, as we make our plans for the future, let us do so with complete trust and reliance upon the perfect will of God, giving Him all the glory and praise.
