Our summer mission campaign for 2016 is in the books. I could not be more proud to be a part of the mission team that went to Cusco, Peru, for our summer campaign. Chase Park sent 13 souls to serve the Lord in Cusco for a week (8 teens and 5 adults). It was truly an amazing week.

On July 22 we left for South America, anxious to serve alongside the brethren at the Ayllu congregation in Cusco. Saturday (the morning most of us arrived), was a day for rest and adjustment to the altitude. Cusco sits at 11,152 feet above sea level; it takes some getting used to. Sunday morning we were blessed to worship with the church in Cusco. The worship service was beautiful and inspiring. There is something special to witness people from a different

culture, who speak a different language than yours, pouring out their heart in worship to the same God that is your God, the God of the Bible. Though we might not have understood everything, we were very much connected to them, through the Savior.

Monday through Thursday the team worked in their various areas. The guys main task while in Cusco was construction. There were two monets (places where women would bring their children who have anemia), that they worked on that needed various things done. They built walls, a sidewalk and installed some lighting.

During the same time the ladies were watching the children of some young mothers so they could participate in classes. The Ayllu congregation put together classes on

how to make cinnamon rolls (and sell for a profit), financial management, and first aid. All of these classes were designed to help the young mothers develop a better life for them and their children. The ladies watching the children was a very important thing because without that, the young moms would not have been able to attend the classes. As a result of the classes, 10 Bible studies were set up!

So much more happened during our week in Cusco and I am looking forward to sharing it with you soon. Until then I wanted to share how proud I am of the team from Chase Park. Eric, Zeke, Georgi, Lynn, Lane, Lucas, Lincoln, Kaylee R, Abby, Kaylee W, Tara, and Cari Beth, I am proud to have served with you. You did a great job!

Bible Class Teachers are A Great Blessing—John Denney

We have some of the greatest Bible School teachers! I want to commend all of our Bible class teachers for the great job you are doing. You put a lot of time and effort in doing this and it shows. Almost every visitor and new member comments on our Bible classes and curriculum. really are impressed with our organization and our Educational Program. They also comment on the number of people who stay for Bible classes after worship on Sunday morning and Wednesday evening. Your commitment that you have to the Lord and to your families really makes a difference with visitors and new members. Keep up the great job encouragement to others as well!

I know as teachers, we have an awesome and tremendous responsibility in teaching our children, our young people, and even in the adult program. But at the same time, what a joy it is to be given the opportunity of teaching God's Word in classes!

Why do we emphasize so much at Chase Park the importance of attending Bible classes? It is the elders' desire for every person attending to grow in faith. How do we build our faith? Romans 10:17 says, "So then faith comes by hearing and hearing by the word of God." Notice what James said, "Receive with meekness implanted word, which is able to save your souls" (James 1:21). Knowing the word of God involves eternal life! It is only by the word of God and obedience to it that we can be saved and that includes our children. If we don't teach our children the truth of God's word while they are under our guidance, they stand a good chance of being eternally lost. We are always

just one generation away from Teaching our children apostasy. and gaining biblical knowledge ourselves, is the most important thing that we can do. God wants His word to be taught diligently (II Tim. 2:15). I'm reminded of the command in the Old Testament-"And these words which I mand you today shall be in your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk to them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up" (Deut. 6:6,7).

Timothy was taught the Holy Scriptures which was able to make him wise unto salvation (II Tim. 3:15). That is why Bible classes are so very important. I believe very strongly in the value of attending and actively participating in our Bible School program! Take full advantage of our classes!

Reading for August 7-13: Galatians 1-6

The Galatian letter is, in many ways, very harsh as Paul vehemently defends himself and the gospel of Christ against those who would deny his authority and its power. His defense of the gospel is both beautiful and powerful as he discusses the difference that Christ had made in his own life and the difference that He can make in the lives of all those who believe on Him and obey. As you read and study this week, consider these thoughts:

- Why did some in Galatia have trouble accepting the gospel of Christ? What can we learn from their example?
- What, in your opinion, is the most important concept taught in the Galatian letter? Why?
