What is My Legacy?

Have you ever thought about what your legacy will be after you are gone from this world? Many of us are busy building a home for our family, exercising to increase our fitness level for a healthy future, and laboring to set aside adequate funds for retirement opportunities. Our efforts in each of these areas are supported by scriptural guidance. But are we “doing it right”? Do we have a complete understanding of what we are endeavoring to do? Do we maintain a vigilant focus to make sure we set and accomplish the appropriate goals?

Legacy is defined as “a gift of property, especially personal property, such as money, by will; a bequest.” It also carries the reasoning of “anything handed down from the past, as from an ancestor or predecessor.”

What is the “gift” you desire most to hand down to those who continue on in this world after we have departed? What do you desire to hand down to them to ensure their futures? From a personal perspective, we understand Jesus' teaching of Matthew 6:19-21 – “Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon the earth, where moth and rust consume, and where thieves break through and steal; ²⁰but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth consume, and where thieves do not break through nor steal; ²¹for where thy treasure is, there will thy heart be also.”

We must strive to ensure our personal spiritual welfare. But what about others around us, our family, our friends, our acquaintances?

As a family, we must strive to “train up our children in the way that they should go.” (Proverbs 22:6) and “bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.” (Ephesians 6:4) Towards our fellow Christian, we are to love, – “A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. ³⁵By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another.” (**John 13:34-35**). Towards all mankind, we must have Paul's determination, “For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek. (**Romans 1:16**) We must be mindful of the condition of the souls of others.

Our sole focus, the only lasting, enduring cause, is the reconciliation of eternal souls to God. Any earthly gift we desire to hand down to others pales in comparison to leading their souls to Christ. May we be focused on leaving the most important legacy to those who follow.
