Trust in the Lord

I love to spend time outdoors enjoying the beautiful landscapes God created for us. As opportunity allows, I enjoy going kayaking on the Flint River. The spring water that feeds the Flint is always cool even on the hottest of days. Many parts of the Flint are covered with a canopy of trees that provide shade to protect one from the scorching summer sun. The trees are always lush and green, and one can often see the deep roots that stretch down the banks of the river as if they were stretching to reach the cool water. I was recently reading in the book of Jeremiah when I came upon a scripture that reminded me of the scene I've encountered many times on the banks of the Flint. The Lord says in Jeremiah 17:7-8,

"Blessed is the man who trusts in the Lord,

And whose hope is the Lord.

8 For he shall be like a tree planted by the waters,

Which spreads out its roots by the river,

And will not fear when heat comes;

But its leaf will be green,

And will not be anxious in the year of drought,

Nor will cease from yielding fruit.

As Christians, we put our hope in the Lord and we trust Him completely in all things. This makes us blessed by God. Just like the tree that is rooted by water never has to worry about drought conditions and will always be able to yield fruit, we too can always trust the Lord to be faithful in His promises.

We find many scriptures throughout the Bible urging us to put our trust in the Lord. We're told from our youth to put God's commands in our heart and to trust the Lord with all our heart and to not lean on our own understandings (Proverbs 3:1,5). David writes in one of his many prayers that the Lord will not forsake those who put their trust in Him and seek Him (Psalms 9:10). The Lord is our strength and our shield, our heart trusts in Him and He helps us (Psalms 28:7). The Hebrew writer assures the faithful that the Lord will never leave nor forsake him, so he can boldly say, "The Lord is my helper; I will not fear." (Hebrews 13:5-6)

In Hebrews 11 we read about the tremendous faith of men like Abel, Enoch, Noah, and Abraham, along with his wife, Sarah. The Hebrew writer says, "These all died in faith, not having received the promises, but having seen them afar off were assured of them, embraced them and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth." (Hebrews 11:13)

What great trust these men and women had in the Lord's promises. We also put our complete trust in the Lord and His promises. Like these great heroes of faith, we are also strangers and pilgrims on the earth. What a great day it will be to receive our eternal reward in Heaven!
